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1. Introduction

General

This is the user manual for your Thetford T2000 series refrigerator.

Read the safety instructions and information on use and maintenance of the refrigerator carefully before continuing. This will enable you to use the refrigerator safely and efficiently. Retain this manual for future reference.

2. Safety

Please read the safety instructions carefully before using the appliance.

General



Risk of serious injury through burning, explosion, clamping, electrocution, suffocation and poisoning or damage to the product.

- Please read the safety instructions carefully before using the refrigerator.
- Use the refrigerator for cooling only and not for anything else. Follow the instructions in this manual. The manufacturer cannot be held liable for damage resulting from improper use or incorrect setting of the controls. If the instructions have not been followed, warranty claims will not be accepted.



Risk of fire and explosion with flammable refrigerant R600a.



This refrigerator is intended for use in mobile leisure vehicles.

- The refrigerator is suitable for camping use.

Children and vulnerable people



This refrigerator may be used by children aged 8 years or older and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities and/or lack of experience and knowledge only if they are supervised or have been given instructions on the safe use of this refrigerator and understand the potential hazards.

- Keep children younger than 8 years away from the refrigerator, except under constant supervision.
- Do not allow children to play with the refrigerator. Children can become trapped and possibly suffocate.
- Do not allow children to clean or maintain this equipment unattended.
- Children aged from 3 to 8 years are allowed to load and unload refrigerating appliances.

Use of the product



Risk of health issues or damage to the refrigerator.

- Use the refrigerator for cooling and keeping frozen food frozen only and not for anything else. Follow the instructions in this manual. The manufacturer cannot be held liable for damage resulting from improper use or incorrect setting of the controls. If the instructions have not been followed, warranty claims will not be accepted.
- Do not use the drawer as a step or ladder.
- Do not use electrical appliances inside the food storage compartments of the refrigerator, unless they are of the type recommended by the manufacturer.
- Never expose the refrigerator to moisture and/or rain.
- Keep ventilation openings, in the refrigerator enclosure or in the built-in structure, clear of obstruction.
- Do not store explosive substances such as aerosol cans with a flammable propellant in this refrigerator.
- Never keep carbonated liquids in the frozen food compartment.
- Never eat ice-cubes or popsicles directly out of the frozen food compartment. This can cause burns.
- As the constant regulation of temperature can not be guaranteed, the refrigerator might not be suitable for proper storage of medications. Refer to the instructions included with the medications.



General use.

- Opening the door for long periods can cause a significant increase of the temperature in the compartments of the refrigerator.
- Actual energy consumption of the refrigerator depends on the power source, ambient temperature, and the content of the cooling system.
- Store consumables in suitable containers or wrapping in the refrigerator to avoid direct contact with interior.
- Two-star frozen-food compartments are suitable for storing pre-frozen food, storing or making ice-cream and making ice cubes.
- One-, two- and three-star compartments are not suitable for the freezing of fresh food.
- To prevent your refrigerator from ice formation, always cover liquid products, let warm products cool down before placing them inside the refrigerator and do not open the door any longer than necessary.

Maintenance and cleaning



Risk of serious injury through and electrocution or damage to the refrigerator.

- Before carrying out any kind of maintenance or cleaning on the refrigerator, switch it off, disconnect the AC and DC power source.
- Do not use mechanical devices or other means to accelerate the defrosting process, other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- Do not use abrasive cleaners, metal scouring pads or hard brushes. They could damage the cooling system.
- Never clean the refrigerator with soap or aggressive, caustic or soda-based cleaning agents.
- Do not expose the refrigerator to water.
- The loose parts of the refrigerator are not suitable for the dishwasher.
- Build-up of dust on the condenser will reduce the performance of the refrigerator and increase the risk of overheating of the cooling system. Have the condenser and cooling fan cleaned by qualified service personnel if you suspect poor performance.

Servicing and troubleshooting



Risk of serious injury through burns, explosion, suffocation, electrocution, fire and poisoning or damage to the refrigerator.



Never open or damage the refrigerant circuit of the cooling system at the back or on the inside of your refrigerator. The cooling system is pressurised and contains flammable substances.



- Never open or damage the refrigerant circuit of the cooling system at the back or on the inside of the appliance. The cooling system is pressurised and contains substances that can be harmful to your health.
- All servicing must be carried out by an approved competent person.
- Make sure that installation, electrical connection and maintenance of the gas system will be done by a qualified technical person, according to the national legislation in force.
- Use only parts supplied by the manufacturer.
- Do not change or adjust anything on the refrigerator, unless the change is authorised by the manufacturer or its representative.
- Thetford recommends an annual inspection service by an approved service centre.

Electricity



Risk of serious injury through electrocution, burns and fire or damage to the refrigerator and the surrounding.

- When positioning the refrigerator, ensure the supply cord is not trapped or damaged.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

- Do not locate multiple portable socket-outlets or portable power supplies at the rear of the refrigerator.

Storage



Risk of damage to the refrigerator due to flooding and moisture.

- If the refrigerating refrigerator is left empty for long periods, switch off, defrost, clean, dry, and leave the door open to prevent mould developing within the refrigerator.

Environmental

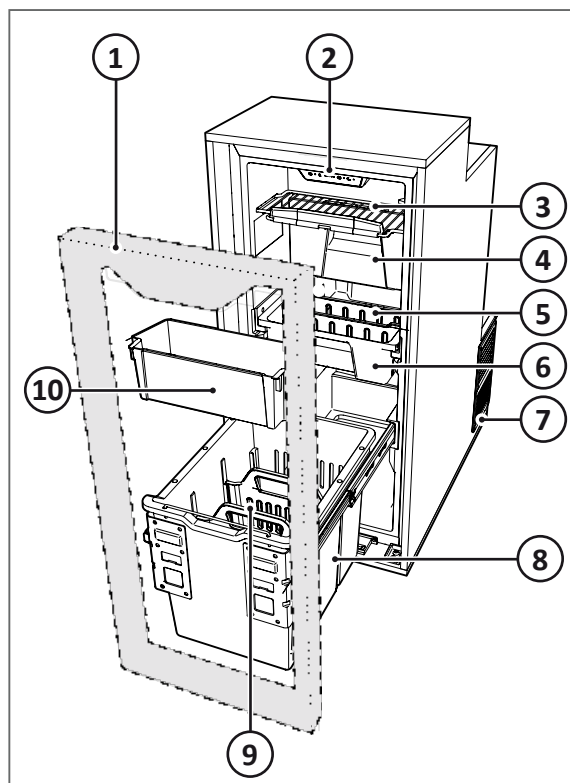


The refrigerant is R600a. Servicing and disposal of refrigerator should be done by a qualified person.

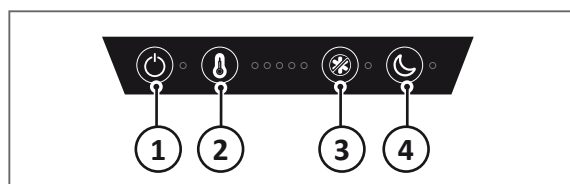
- When the vehicle is exposed to full sun light, it is strongly recommended to apply proper ventilation in the vehicle to reduce energy consumption.

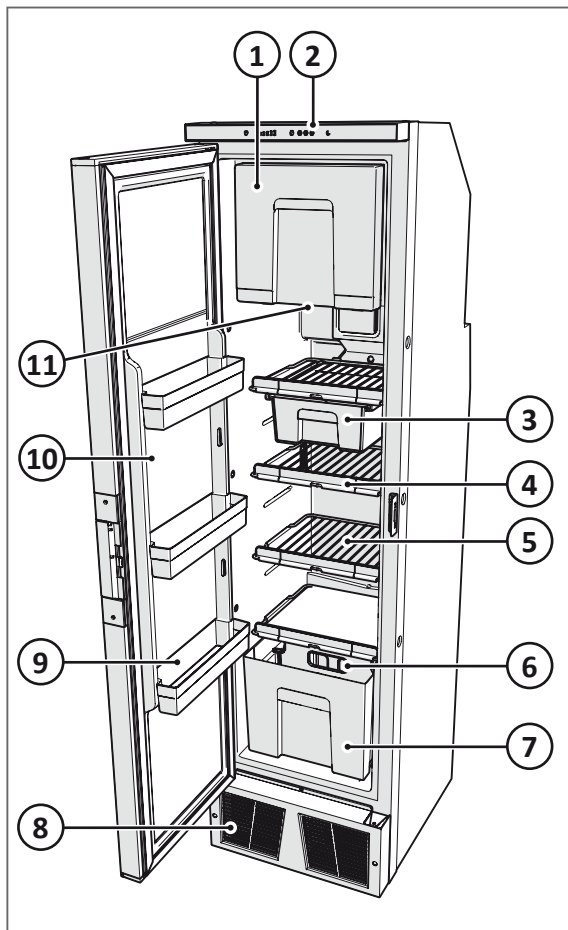

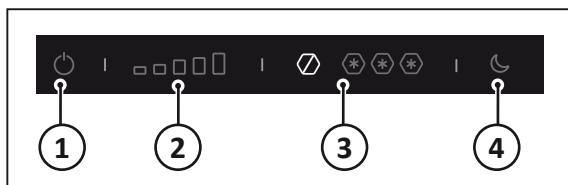

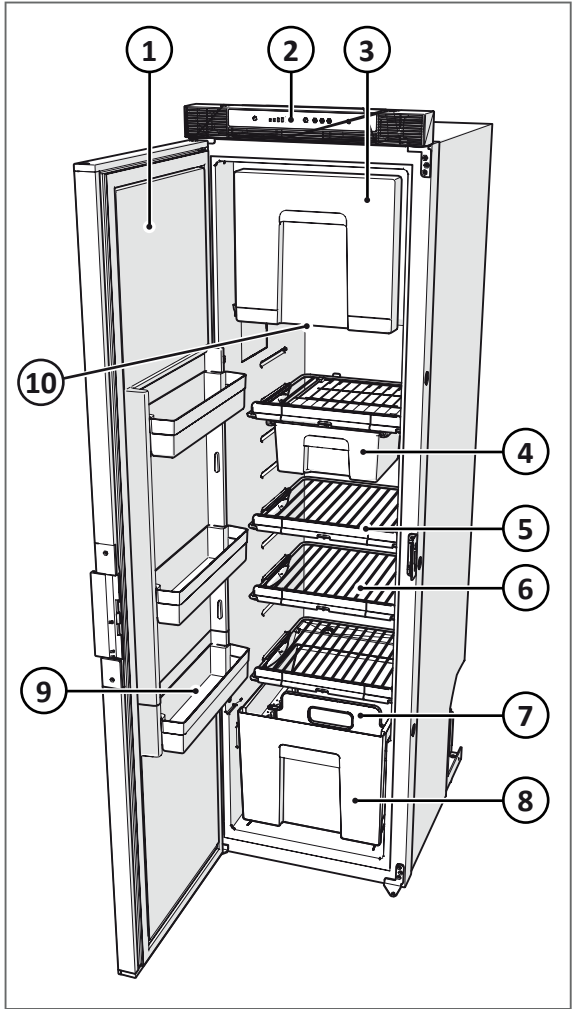

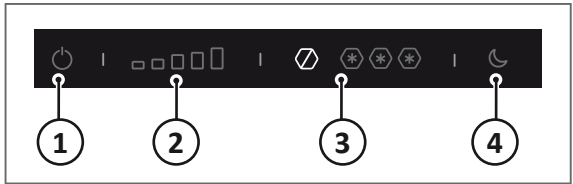

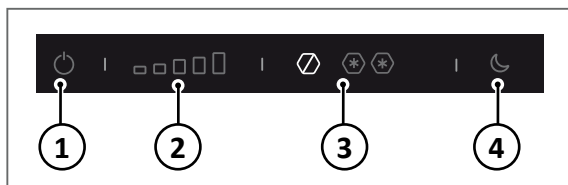

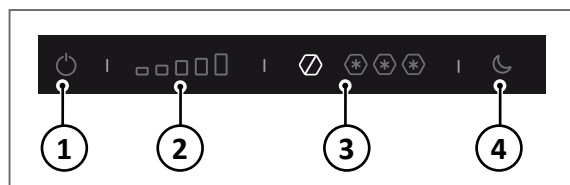

4. Before use



Read the applicable instructions in chapter *Safety* first.

Before using the appliance:

- Ensure that all packaging materials have been removed.
- Clean the appliance with warm water and household detergent and dry carefully with a soft cloth.
- Ensure that the DC electricity supply is connected and turned on.

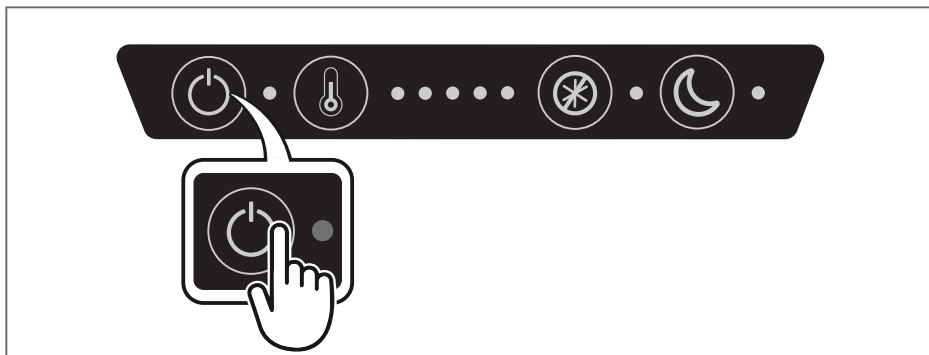

Switching on

To switch on the refrigerator:

T2095

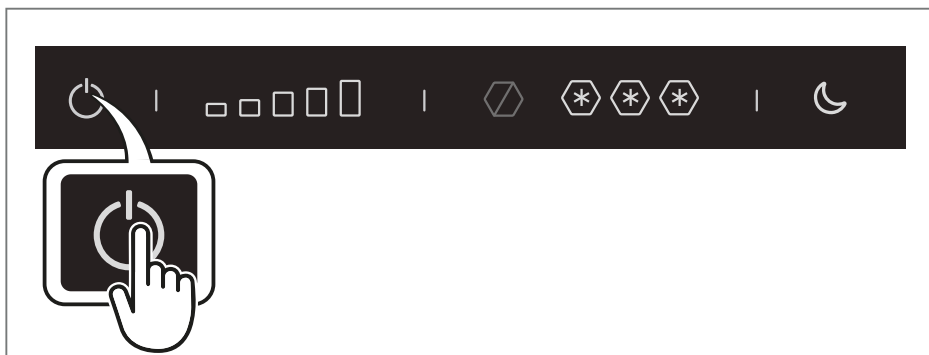
- Push the on/off button and hold it until the indicator lights up.



After a few seconds the control panel will change to stand-by and locked mode. The blue on/off indicator light stays lit, indicating the refrigerator is still in function.

All other models

- Press on/off icon and hold until it lights up.



After a few seconds the control panel will change to stand-by and locked mode. The blue on/off icon light stays lit, indicating the refrigerator is still in function.



For optimal performance, switch on the refrigerator 4 hours before placing food inside the refrigerator.

- To switch off the refrigerator, push and hold the on/off button for a few seconds.

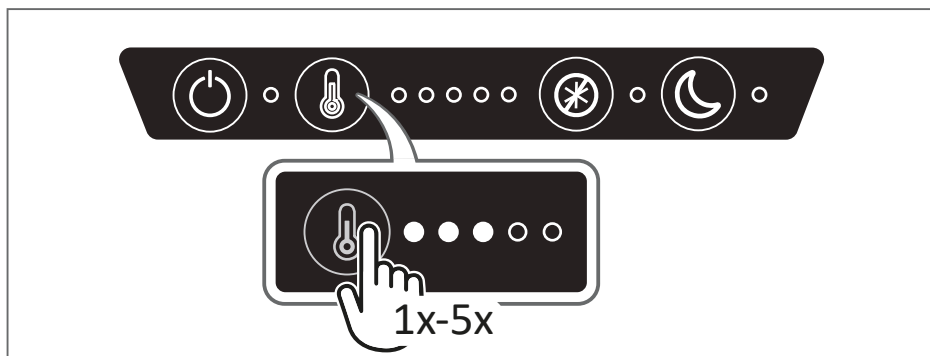
Selecting cooling level fresh food compartment

Select one of five levels to set the desired level of cooling of the fresh food compartment.

To select the desired cooling level:

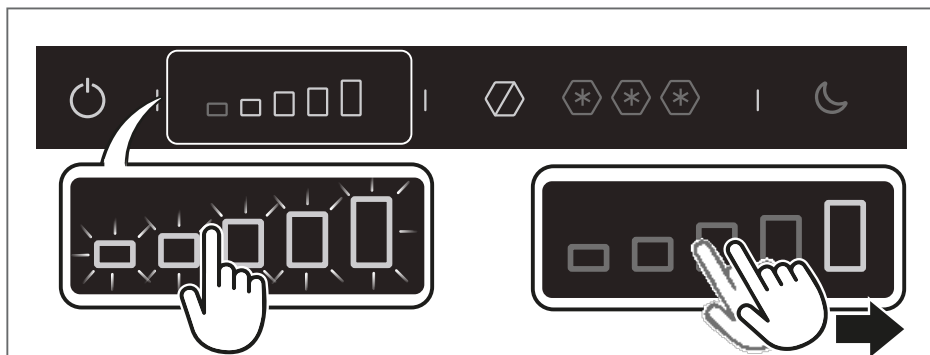
T2095

- Unlock the control panel: press one of the buttons. The T2095 control panel automatically unlocks when opening the door.
- Press the temperature button several times until the desired level is reached.



All other models

- Unlock the control panel: press one of the buttons.
- Press the fresh food area and hold it for a few seconds until the temperature icons start blinking.
- Slide or press the temperature icons to select the desired level.



After a few seconds, the control panel will save the settings and go to the locked stand-by mode.



When the display is locked, the icons will turn off, only on/off and night mode will stay illuminated.

Selecting cooling level frozen food compartment

Depending on the model the frozen food compartment has up to three cooling levels.



Always look at the packaging instructions of your food products for preservation level.

- Thetford advises to set the frozen food compartment on the highest setting. A lower setting is only needed to reduce the energy consumption.
- The T2095 has only Medium temperature setting.
- The T2156 has only Low and Medium temperature setting.

Off:



Temperature in the frozen food compartment is kept below 20°C. In this setting the energy consumption is very low, to maximizing off-grid time. To activate: press and hold for a few seconds.

Low:



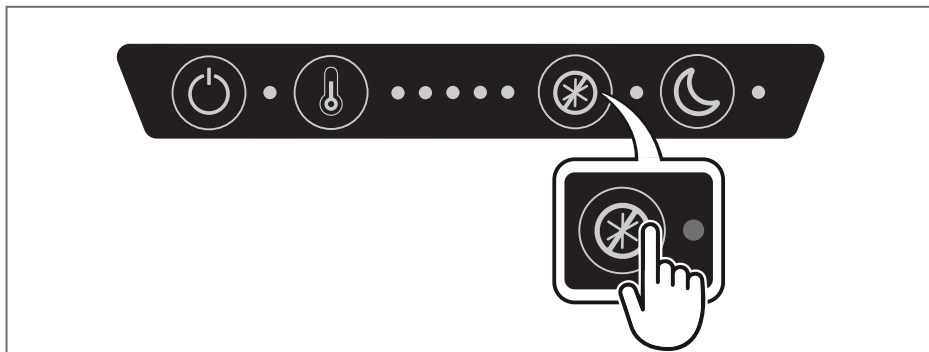
Temperature in the frozen food compartment is around -6°C. This setting is suited for making ice cubes and keeping products frozen for a short period of time. This setting saves energy compared to the higher settings.

Medium:			Temperature in the frozen food compartment is around -12°C. This setting is suited for keeping products frozen for an average period of time. This setting uses an average amount of energy.
High:			Temperature in the frozen food compartment is around -18°C. This setting is suited for keeping products frozen for a long period of time. Also this setting is advised when storing ice cream products. This setting uses the most amount of energy.

To select the desired cooling level:

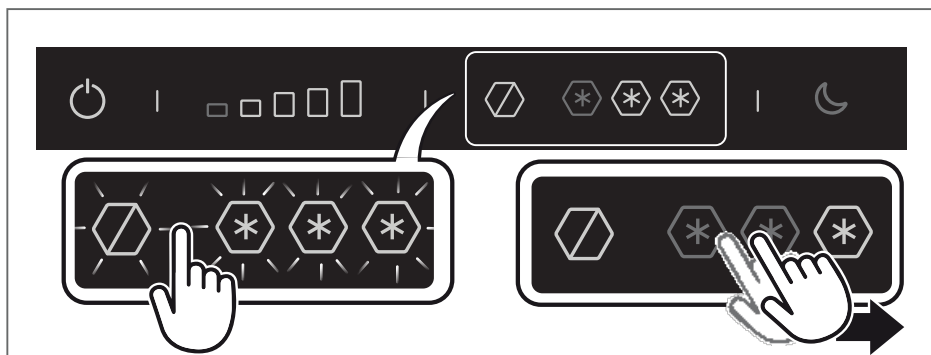
T2095

- Unlock the control panel: the control panel automatically unlocks when opening the door.
- Press the on/off button to turn cooling of the frozen food compartment on or off.



All other models

- Unlock the control panel: press one of the buttons.
- Press the frozen food area and hold it for a few seconds until the icons start blinking.
- Slide or press the temperature icons to select the desired level.



After a few seconds, the control panel will save the settings and go to the locked stand-by mode.



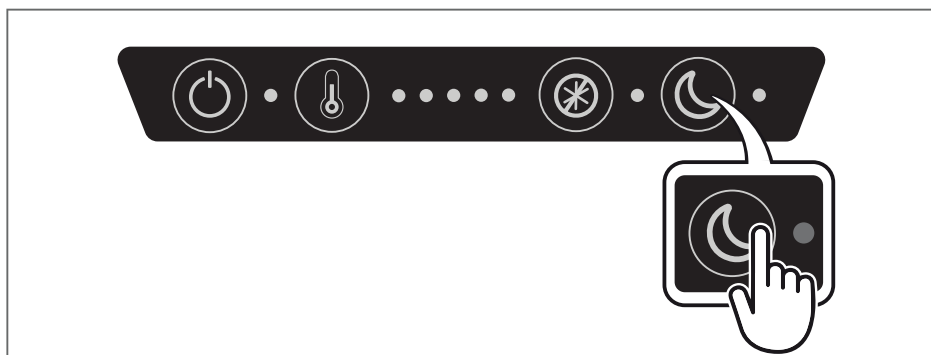
When the display is locked, the icons will turn off, only on/off and night mode will stay illuminated.

Selecting night mode

The refrigerator will select the lowest noise setting where possible. When the refrigerator needs to run harder (due to higher ambient temperatures and/or warm products), it may result in an increase of noise. You can switch on the night mode, to reduce the noise to a minimum. The cooling down time might take longer. The blue light indicates the night mode is activated.

T2095

- Press one of the buttons to unlock the control panel (T2095 panel unlocks automatically on opening the door).
- Push the night mode button until the indicator lights up.



All other models

- Press one of the buttons to unlock the control panel.
- Push the night mode icon until it lights up.



Use night mode only when temperatures in the vehicle are below 30°C. The night mode will switch off automatically after 12 hours. When switching off the night mode manually, it will go to automatic temperature control.

Switch off/on blue indication light (T2095 only)

Model T2095 is equipped with an exterior light behind the vent to indicate the refrigerator is running.

To switch off/on the blue light:

- Press the frozen food compartment button for 10 seconds.



To ensure if the refrigerator is still running open the door. The control panel and interior lights are on.

Use of the fresh food compartment



A number of shelves and drawer dividers are secured to prevent inadvertent entrapment and possible suffocation of children.

- Do not remove or reposition the secured shelves or secured drawer dividers, so children have no space to be entrapped in the refrigerator.



To prevent ice build-up in your refrigerator, always cover liquid products, let warm products cool down before placing them inside the refrigerator. Do not open the door any longer than necessary.

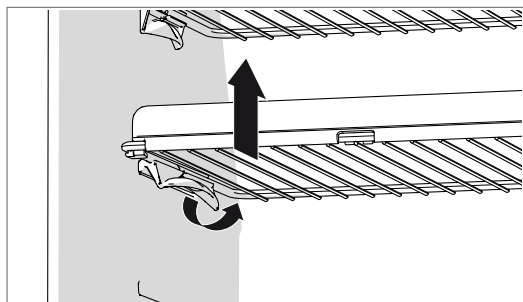
- The maximum load of the large shelf is 12 kg and the maximum load of the small shelf is 6 kg.
- For model T2095: the maximum storage capacity of the middle drawer is 8kg and the bottom drawer 20kg.
- For other models: the maximum storage capacity of the drawer is 15kg.

To organise your refrigerator as desired, the unsecured storage shelves, drawer dividers and door bins can be moved.



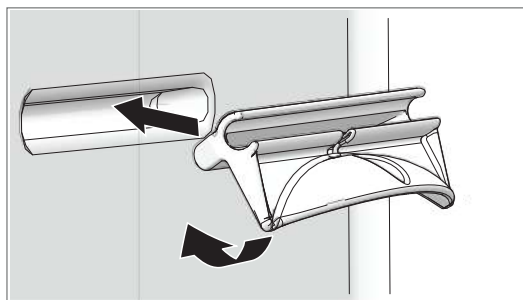
Ensure that the door can still be closed after reorganizing shelves and bins.

To reposition an unsecured storage shelf:



- Turn the plastic clamp of the storage shelf upwards.
- Lift the left side a bit.

Replace storage shelf



- Move the storage shelf to the desired position.
- Place right side (side without clamp) of the storage shelf in the refrigerator wall.
- Place the other side (with the clamp) in the corresponding groove.
- Turn the plastic clamp downwards.

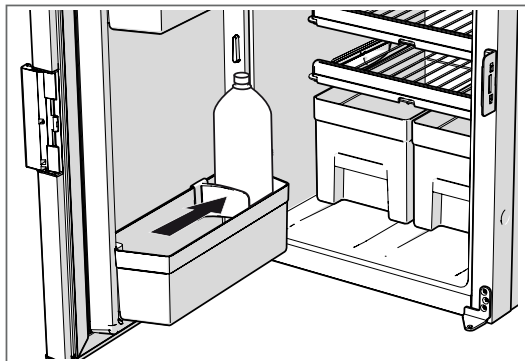


In the drawing the clamp is shown without the shelf.

Use of the frozen food compartment

The frozen food compartment can be used to store perishable foodstuffs or frozen foods. Refer to *Selecting cooling level frozen food compartment* for more information on the regulated frozen food compartment.

While driving



- Make sure no products in the refrigerator can move while driving. Secure the bottles in the door with the bottle retainer, bottles and large products in the drawer with drawer dividers and raise the shelf food retainers to hold the products on the shelves.

- Close the refrigerator door.



When you push to close the door of the refrigerator, the door locks automatically.

- For models with a travel lock: secure the lock. The door lock will extra prevent the door from opening while driving.

6. Maintenance and cleaning



Read the applicable instructions in chapter *Safety* first.

Thetford recommends an annual inspection service by an approved service centre. Clean the refrigerator on a regular basis.

- Always remove any spills or contamination immediately with a mild household cleaner and soft cloth.
- If needed, remove the shelves, door bins, vegetable bins and clean the inside of the refrigerator and loose parts.
- Clean the outside of the refrigerator with a damp soft cloth.



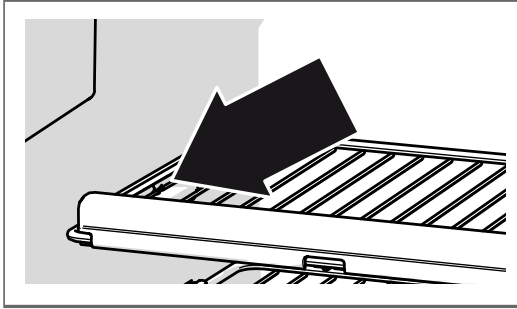
Only for maintenance purposes it is allowed to remove a secured storage shelf or secured drawer divider. Always replace and secure the storage shelf or drawer divider to the exact same installation position after maintenance.



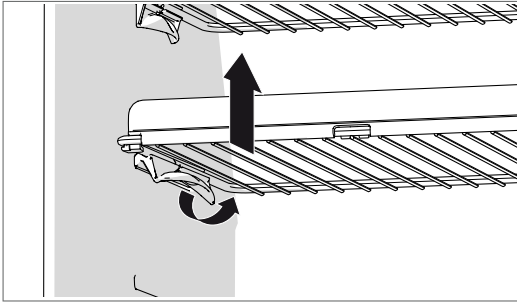
Only for refrigerators installed on floor level: Dust underneath the refrigerator might block the airflow required for a proper performance. Therefore, frequently remove all dust from this area, e.g. using a vacuum cleaner.

- Thetford recommends to clean the cooling system once every 2 years or when you suspect bad performance or too high energy consumption.
- For models T2160, T2175 and T2208 a filter is in place. it is strongly recommended to clean the filter once a year, or more often if necessary. Always replace the filter to the exact same installation position after maintenance.

Replace a secured storage shelf

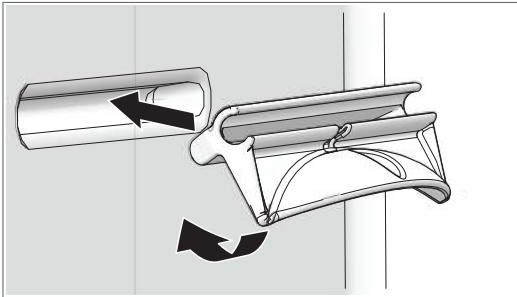


- Remove the screws that are placed in the shelf near the shelf clamp.

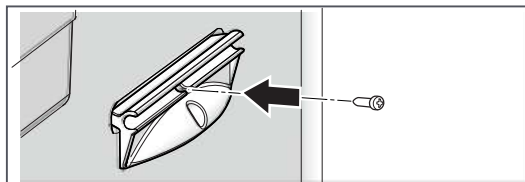


- Turn the plastic clamp of the storage shelf upwards.
- Lift the left side a bit.
- Remove the storage shelf.

To replace the secured storage shelf after maintenance:



- Place right side (side without clamp) of the storage shelf in the refrigerator wall.
- Place the other side (with the clamp) in the corresponding groove.
- Turn the plastic clamp downwards.



- Replace the screw.



In the drawings, the clamp is shown without the shelf.

Replace a secured drawer divider

- Undo the screws that secure the drawer divider.
- Remove the drawer divider

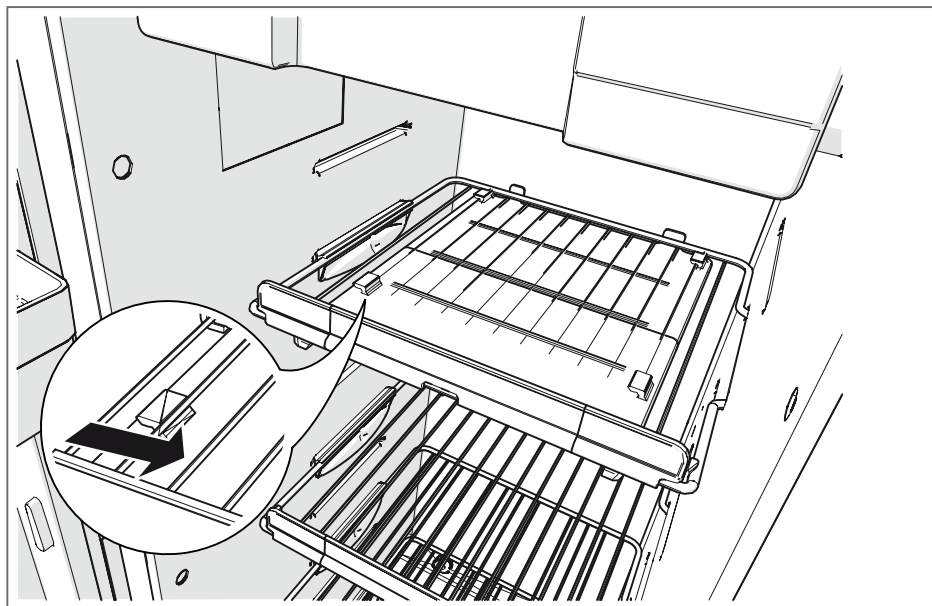
To replace the secured drawer after maintenance:

- Place the drawer divider.
- Replace the screw.

Remove a slide-out box system (T2138 / T2152 only)

To temporarily remove the slide-out box system:

- Completely open the refrigerator door.
- Remove the slide-out box, by pulling the slide-out box towards you while you tilt the box upwards.
- Remove the shelf with slide-out box system, refer to *Replace a secured storage shelf*.
- Push the rail system to the right, as illustrated.



- Clean the slide-out box and slide out box system.
- After cleaning, place the system back in reverse order.



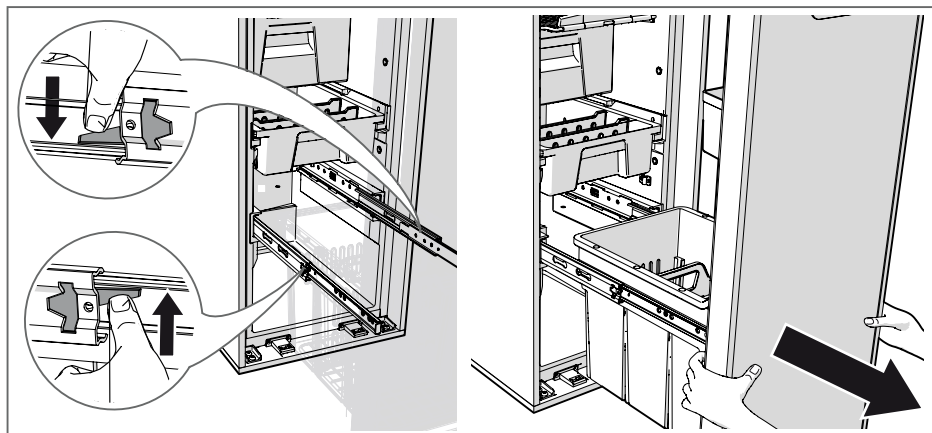
Make sure the slide-out box system snaps into place.

Remove a drawer

T2095

To remove the drawer:

- Open the door.
- Locate the left unlocking button of the drawer guides and push the unlocking button up.
- Locate the right unlocking button of the drawer guides and push the unlocking button down.
- Pull the drawer out of the drawer guides and clean it.
- After cleaning, slide the drawer guides back into its original position until they snap into place.

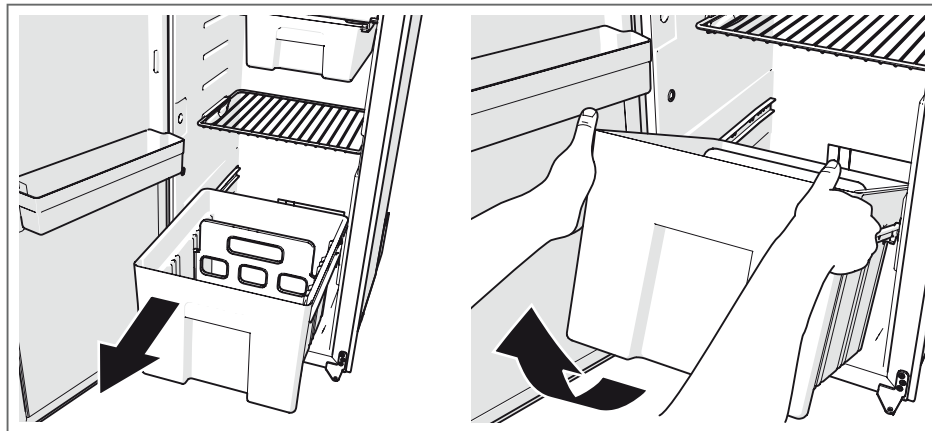


The door with drawer is one part. Preferably perform this procedure with two people.

T2120 / T2138 / T2152

To remove the drawer:

- Completely open the refrigerator door and pull the drawer until the stop.
- Then lift the drawer at the front, as illustrated.

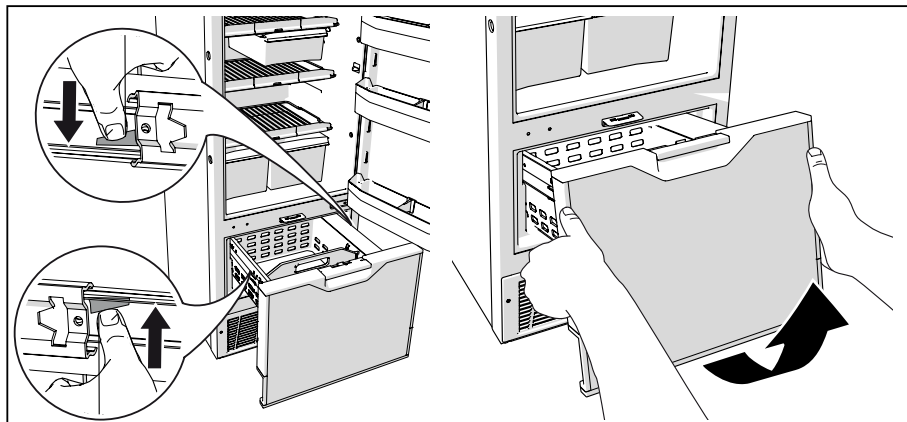


- Remove and clean the drawer.
- After cleaning, place the drawer back in reverse order.

T2160 / T2175 / T2208

To remove the drawer:

- Pull the drawer until the stop and push it a little bit back.
- Then push the guide locks backwards, as illustrated.



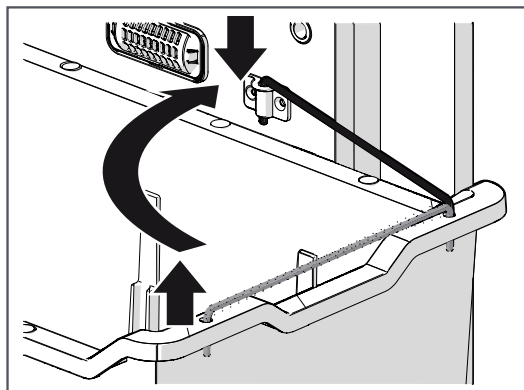
- Pull the drawer further to the front and lift the wheels over the curves.
- Remove and clean the drawer.
- After cleaning, pull out the guides until they snap into place.
- Place the drawer back in reverse order.

Storage

If you do not use the refrigerator for a longer period:

- Empty the refrigerator.
- Defrost the frozen food compartment.
- Clean the complete refrigerator thoroughly.
- Keep the refrigerator door and the frozen food compartment door open.

Keep the doors open: T2095



- Open the door.
- Pull left side of the storage lock out of the bottle and vegetable bin.
- Rotate the storage lock towards the sidewall of the appliance.
- Secure the storage lock in the hole in the sidewall.

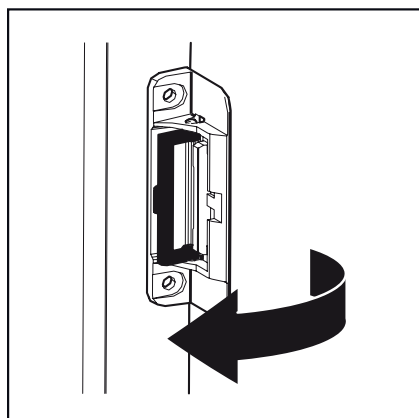


Do not use storage lock while driving.

To use the refrigerator after storage:

- Pull the storage lock out of the hole in the sidewall.
- Rotate the storage lock back to its original position.
- Push the storage lock back into the bottle and vegetable bin.
- Close the door.

Keep the doors open: all other models



- Open the door.
- Rotate the storage lock.
- Close the door until you hear the first click.



Make sure the door is still slightly open.

To use the refrigerator after storage:

- Rotate the storage lock back to its original position.

Defrosting

Ice can build up in the frozen food compartment and on the back surface of the refrigerator compartment. When more than 3mm of ice has built up in any location of either compartment, the refrigerator needs to be defrosted. Failure to do this may damage the cooling system. To defrost the refrigerator:

- Remove all food.
- Switch off the refrigerator.
- Remove the drawer as described under *Maintenance and cleaning*.
- Put a towel in the frozen food compartment and on the bottom of the fresh food compartment to catch any leakage water.
- Make sure the frozen food compartment door is opened by a small gap, by inserting a non-sharp object in between the frozen food compartment door seal and the cabinet liner.
- In case the external drainage possibility is not used, empty the drip tray when all ice is gone.
- Thoroughly dry the refrigerator after defrosting.

7. Disposal

When your refrigerator has reached its end of life, dispose the product according to the local rules. Do not dispose the refrigerator with normal household waste.

Service
